

Pesticide Container Disposal Policy

Water Soluble pesticide containers such as Demand CS, Temprid or Dragnet, etc. need to be triple rinsed, punctured, caps removed and have the WHMIS hazard symbol crossed out prior to being placed into your garbage bin.





<u>Oil Based</u> containers such as Pyrocide 300 needs to be punctured, caps removed, and have the WHMIS hazard symbol crossed out prior to being placed into your garbage bin.



Empty **Rodenticide** pails such as Resolv, First Strike, Contrac and Final Blox, etc. need to be punctured to make them un-usable, and then placed into your garbage bin.



Empty **Bait Tubes** such as Seclira, Avert DF, etc. can be disposed of in your garbage bin.



Aerosol canisters should be turned upside down, turned away from your body and all pressure is to be released from the canister. Empty canister should be placed into your blue bin labelled for Aerosol Disposal.



Empty pesticide containers <u>should never</u> be disposed of at the customers site or in a residential home garbage bin. If you have any questions regarding proper disposal of any pesticide container, please consult with the LABEL or manufacturer. For information on disposal of unused, unwanted product contact the provincial regulatory agency or the manufacturer.
